OVERVIEW | Broadside combines the talents of winemakers Chris Brockway of Broc Cellars and Brian Terrizzi of Giornata to produce artisanal, balanced wine from interesting vineyards in small quantities that are priced for people to drink. Their winemaking favors a natural approach in that all wines are minimally handled to best express the grape, site and vintage. The commitment is to wines of balance and finesse that make sense on the dinner table. They harvest at lower sugars, employ native fermentation and use little to no new oak.

WINES | Margarita Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon - 100% Cabernet Sauvignon sourced exclusively from the Margarita Vineyard. The vines were planted in 1999. The vineyard is the southernmost vineyard in the Paso Robles appellation. It is actually much closer to the town of San Luis Obispo than Paso Robles. The vineyard is also located closer to the Pacific Ocean than most other vineyards in the Paso Robles appellation. It's just 14 miles from the Pacific Ocean at an altitude of 1000 feet. This location results in perfect conditions for growing Cabernet Sauvignon with warm days and cool nights. The resulting wine has an abundant intensity of fruit, but still maintains balance and freshness. In addition, hillside plantings and calcareous soil summed with lots of fossilized sea shells give the wine a mineral thread uncommon to most red wines at this pricepoint. The wine was produced and bottled by Broadside a few miles east of the vineyard in the town of Creston.

Barrel aged for 15 months in 10% new French oak 65% used French oak (1-3 years) 25% used American oak (1-3 years).
